Discussion: The Providence City Council will discuss the possibility of sharing sales tax with Logan City on a 27 development near the south side of 1200 South in Logan and on the west side of SR165. 28 Mayor Watts called Mayor Simmons about a developer that would like to develop east of Watkins Printing. Providence City 29 limits are a portion of that property. Logan City asked if we would share the sales tax on this property. How would the 30 Council propose to split this? Mayor Watts suggested 50%. There will be a road that will give Providence access to this 31 property. Logan also has a piece to the west of this property. On the west side Providence City goes all the way to 32 Blackhawk. 33 This would not set precedence for any other property. The Council would like Mayor Simmons to obtain specifics from 34 Mayor Watts. 35 36 Item No. 2. Resolution 09-030: The Providence City Council will consider for adoption a resolution approving interlocal 37 agreements between Cache County and Providence City for law enforcement services and animal control services. 38 Motion to approve: R Liechty, K Baker second 39 S Bankhead said the only changes to this agreement are the hours. 40 D Astle asked how many animal incidents they do per month. 41 S Bankhead said 15 to 22 incidents a month. 42 D Astle would like to look at the budget next year and see if we need this much coverage. 43 S Bankhead said they are constantly patrolling for animals. 44 J Russell said last month they spent about 160 hours. Is there a schedule that they go by from the sheriff's office? 45 S Bankhead said even if the assigned officer is gone we still have an officer that takes care of Providence. We have two 46 officers that are assigned to the City. They do have a presence. This is less expensive than doing it ourselves. 47 R Simmons would like to look at the contract at the end of the year and see if the additional \$19,000 is worth it.

D Astle asked about removing trees completely.

- S Bankhead said trees are problematic when a developer does it before a lot is sold. Who will take care of the trees?
- 39 D Low said do we require homeowners to plant trees in the parkstrips.
- 40 S Bankhead said this is not required. In Title 7 we talk about trees within the parkstrip. There is a tree list that needs to be 41 followed.
- 42 D Astle feels like trees beautify communities.
- 43 R Simmons said that some subdivisions require trees thru their CC&R's.
- 44 D Astle said maybe this is where those kinds of requirements should be.
- 45 K Baker would like for the Planning Commission to look at a tree ordinance requiring trees in the parkstrips and when this 46
- should be required.
- 47 S Bankhead said we could look at a landscaping bond with the building permit ordinance.
- 48 D Low asked what the size requirement for a tree is.
- 49 S Bankhead said 2 ½ inches.
- 50 D Low asked about sidewalks on page 5. Sidewalks are required on both sides of a development.
- 51 D Astle asked about the terrain not allowing a sidewalk on both sides. Shouldn't we have some flexibility with this?
- 52 S Bankhead said in a new area if they can design a street they can put in a sidewalk.
- 53 D Astle asked about 400 east and Canyon Road.
- 54 S Bankhead said that area has its own rules made by the Council.
- 55 J Russell suggested the Planning Commission look at the sidewalks again with the trees.
- 56 D Astle said he thinks sidewalks should be required not will be required.
- 57 S Bankhead said when this started 2 years ago everyone wanted sidewalks.

STAFF REPORTS:

S Bankhead asked if the Council was rethinking sidewalks everywhere.

D Low said anywhere a new development has sidewalks they should be on both sides.

D Astle said sidewalks are required about 97% of the time. He doesn't feel like we can always put sidewalks on both sides of the street. He doesn't feel like there should be an ordinance that requires this.

D Low asked what would be 3%.

D Astle said topography. If developers know that sidewalks are required then they can make it happen.

S Bankhead said the Sauerkraut dinner and car show was this weekend. We had 61 cars at the car show. The Sauerkraut dinner was not as well attended this year. Jeremy Jones with Iron Gate Grill did an excellent job with the dinner. There were quite a few vendors in the bazaar portion. The numbers for the dinner were down about 30%. There was a live band at the car show. We have talked about doing krautdogs on Saturday for the car show and moving the dinner back to Friday night. These are things we will have to work out. One of the problems is the venue. We don't have enough seating available. This dinner doesn't pay for itself. It does cost the City money, S Bankhead would like to get a volunteer citizen committee together for the dinner next year. This is the way it used to be done. The sponsors have been great helping with this dinner.

Winter parking hours go into effect on November 1st. Deputy Robinson and Deputy Madsen have been coming in regularly to report. Deputy Madsen has been trying to make a more visible presence in the City. Public Works has been busy getting ready for winter.

- J Russell asked about illnesses. He wanted to know about contingencies. There needs to be something in place.
- S Bankhead said there has been enough cross training that we can survive with fewer people.

- 56 He talked about the number of incidents and citations. He meets with the Mayor and Skarlet once a month about the budget.
- 57 S Bankhead said the sales tax revenue is down from last year. Right now we are right where we projected. It is still doable to 58

meet our projections but sales tax is not something we can hang our hat on. We are putting together a contingency plan.
