


Library News

Introduces Plumbing Code Compliance for protection and conservation of safe drinking water. We have prepared this letter to inform you about the principles of water safety and conservation. Please take the time to read it. If you have any questions, please call us at (435) 753-4546 ext. 21 Back flow prevention programs are required to assure safe water for drinking bathing and cooking. Safe drinking water is one of our most precious natural resources. It is our job to provide and protect the safe drinking water supply. It is a responsibility that we share with you, since you use the water, and because your plumbing system is tied into the community water system. Providence City's part: to regulate the public water system and to ensure that reasonable safety measures are taken to protect the safe drinking water from the point of treatment to the point of use - your home or business. We must meet all Department of Health and EPA Standards. Here is your part: to make sure that your plumbing system is safe. By working together, we can keep our drinking water safe, for the good of our families and our community.



You must protect your system from thermal expansion after installing a back flow preventer at the service entrance. Use either an expansion tank or an anti-siphon ball cock assembly with relief feature.
