We have come to an arrangement with the help of Rocky Mountain Power to start replacing the dying and unhealthy looking trees under the power lines. We will start by replacing the trees from 100 North to Center Street on the west side of the road. We will also have the stumps ground out and new trees placed in the park strip. These trees we are assured by Rocky Mountain Power will not grow tall enough to get into the way of the power lines. We would like to ask the help of the citizens who lie between 100 North and Center Street on the west side of the road to please assist us in keeping these new trees alive by helping with watering of the

Thanks to the Providence City Staff, Public Works Department, Tree Committee and Rocky Mountain Power for much time spent to come to this resolve. In the fall we hope to do another block of trees and continue this schedule until all dying trees have been replaced.

The CMPO road from First East in Logan City to Providence's 100 North is underway and will be completed in the fall of this year; this will move traffic into Logan City and back to Providence much more efficiently.

We now have just about enough volunteers for the C.E.R.T. training program and hope to get just a few more and we hope to start our training the end of June or first of July. Thanks for those who have signed for their support and please just a few more.

I am so proud to be a citizen of Providence City and the heritage that has grown with our city and community. We have recently received some of the greatest compliments from people looking to move into Cache Valley and finding that one of the first spots they look for homes is here in Providence. #### MESSAGE FROM YOUR CITY COUNCIL:

The following actions were taken by the City Council in meetings for April 27 and May 11. We continue to seek citizen input concerning the decisions that are made on your behalf. We encourage you to attend the Council meetings and let your thoughts and concerns be known so that we as a City Council can better serve you.

#### April 27, 2010

- The City Council held a joint workshop with the Providence City Planning Commission and Development Review Committee to consider code amendments to Providence City Code Title 10 Zoning Regulations.
- The Council adopted a resolution approving an agreement between Tony's Grove and Providence City for temporary site plan approval, Tony's Grove South.
- The Council continued the consideration for adopting a resolution approving the bid for a splash pad.
- The Council held a discussion on hunting and trapping the Providence City.

#### May 11, 2010

- The Council adopted a resolution adjusting the 2010 Budget for the following Funds: General, Capital Project, Water, Sewer, and Storm Water.
- The Council continued consideration for adopting a resolution approving an agreement between GBS Compliance Services (GBS) and Providence City for COBRA Services.
- The Council continued consideration for adopting a resolution approving the bid for a splash pad.
- The Council held a discussion about the effects of the Spring Creek Parkway realignment on Property located generally at 220 North Spring Creek Parkway, requested by Stephen and Susan Roberts.
- The Council held a discussion about hunting and trapping in Providence City.
- The Council held a discussion about the proposed tentative budget for 2011 for all funds.

We hope that Spring will finally be here and we can all get our Spring cleanup finished. The City has picked up the trash from the curbs to help the citizens with that effort. The Green Waste bins are fully used at the City sheds and are a great help in keeping our City "Green". These bins are placed in our City as a service. We as a Council encourage the citizens to help keep the area around the bins clean and well managed.

The City Council and City Staff continue to work through the budget process for our next fiscal year. Public hearing will be held to help with this process. Citizens are encouraged to attend these hearings and give comments to help the City prepare a realistic and accurate budget for the coming year.

#### **Planning Commission Actions:**

- The Planning Commission continued a study item on a request from Amsource for a code amendment for Title 10 Chapter 6 Use Regulations (Amended: Ordinance No. 006-2009 09/22/2009; Ordinance No. 011-2009, 12/08/2009). They did not take action on this at this time.
- The Planning Commission held a discussion on Nondepository Financial Institutions. This discussion has been continued and will come back as an action item at the next meeting.
- The Commission continued a study item on code amendment for Title 10 Chapter 6 Use Regulations, including removing some uses from the Use Chart and adding new uses to the Use Chart which may be permitted, conditional, or incidental. Uses being discussed include but are not limited to nondepository financial institutions, personal services, recreation/entertainment, and theater.
