A Splash Pad in Providence! I hope you are having a fun summer. Here is a riddle that might add to some of that "fun".  
"I am the first one of these in the Valley! I am roughly 800 square feet in size! I put smiles on faces of children. I am located at Alma Leonhardt Park in Providence. I am open for "splashing" from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm. I am free to use. I will be open all summer until Labor Day. What am I? I am a Splash Pad.

If you do not know what a "splash pad" is, go down to the park and take a look. It is located at 310 West 250 North. We hope all who are interested will participate in playing at the splash pad at the park. However, we would hope that you will help us all take care of it, and the grounds surrounding it, so that it can be enjoyed now, and also for many years to come. Here are five (5) things we would love everyone to know:

1. Please no bikes, skateboards, rollerblades or anything like these on the Splash Pad.
2. Please pick up your belongings and help pick up litter that other have left. We want our park to be beautiful!
3. Please have respect and consideration as a guiding rule, especially that there are young children at play.
4. Only push the button once every 8 minutes. Please help educate those who do not know how the button works. The water cycle goes for 8 minutes after the button is pushed. More pushes will wear out the button.

## **Planning Commission Actions:**

- The Commission discussed Accessory Buildings as a use with Home Businesses.
- A Public Hearing was held to consider for recommendation to the City Council a request to amend Providence City Code Title 10 Zoning Regulations, Chapter 8 Area Regulation, by adding Section 7 Site Requirements for Seasonal, Semi-Permanent and Temporary Business Facilities. This was sent onto City Council for recommendation to approve.
- The Commission considered for recommendation to the City Council a request to amend the Land Use Authority and Conditions/ Design Standards for Chapter 10-4-4, Mixed Use District, Commercial Highway District and Commercial General District. They recommended a join workshop with City Council.



## **Message from Public Works:**

As some of you may have noticed, there have been trees removed along the west side of Main Street between 100 North and Center Street. This is being done as a cooperative effort between Rocky Mountain Power and Providence City to remove the older trees and replace them with new trees that are appropriate to be located underneath the power lines. 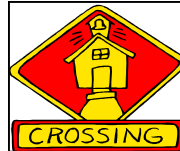

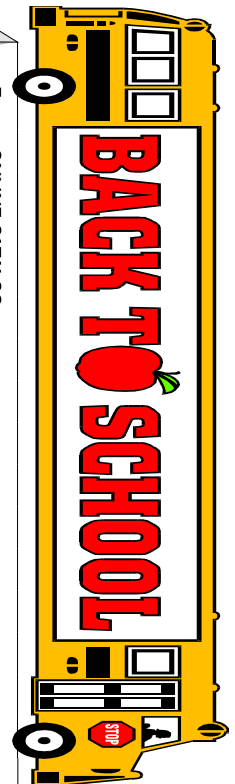

Bear River Head Start offers FREE preschool services to low-income children and children with disabilities ages 3-5 years. They also work with parents to meet their child's educational and family goals.



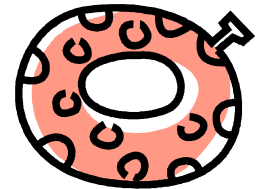
