I have received a lot of questions about Center Street between 300 and 400 East and what the City is doing. We are waiting for the final permit to move forward to perform the repairs needed. The City is installing a pre-cast cement box culvert and rebuilding the road from 300 East to 400 East. We ask and thank you for your patience and will have the repairs done as soon as possible and Center Street reopened.

## **MESSAGE FROM YOUR CITY COUNCIL:**

It is hard to believe that Fall is already here and the leaves and temperatures are changing. Along with the season change, comes fall clean-up for many of us. I would like to remind you that the green waste bins are still at the City sheds for your use. At our last City Council meeting the following items were approved:

- ▶ The Council approved the Sheriff's contract for law enforcement and animal control services for our City.
- ▶ Approved an extension of contract time for consultant services with CRS in conjunction with the Gateway Drive expansion project.
- ▶ Considered enacting an ordinance establishing a temporary land use regulation prohibiting the construction of all non-residential structures in all single-family zones on a lot with double frontage, or two or adjacent lots owned by the same owner.
- ▶ Our Mayor, City Staff, City Council, Planning Commission, and other departments and committees continue to work very hard to keep our City beautiful, efficient, and progressive for our citizens.

## **Planning Commission Actions:**

- ▶ The Providence City Planning Commission discussed modifying the ordinances in regards to lot consolidation and non-dwelling unit structures such as pools, fences, etc. as a primary use on a lot in platted residential subdivisions.
- ▶ The Providence City Planning Commission discussed a request from Ivan Christensen to rezone the property located at 207 East 100 North from the current SFT Single-Family Traditional (required 12,000 square foot lots) to SFR Single-Family Residential (10,000 square foot lots). He would also like the ordinance changed to allow 10 foot rear setbacks for Single Family Residential in the Downtown Area.



## **Winter Parking**

Winter Parking is just around the corner. No vehicles can be parked along the road between November 1 and April 1 from Midnight until 6:00 am. This allows the City to do a great job plowing snow once the snow falls. Make sure you remind any guests that you may have visiting you of our ordinance. Vehicles not complying with this ordinance may be subject to a \$25 fine. Be prepared!

## Test Your *Smoke* Detectors!

All smoke alarms in your house should be tested once a month, and their batteries replaced annually.

Properly installed and maintained smoke alarms in the home are considered one of the best and least expensive means of providing an early warning of a potentially deadly fire. Smoke alarms save lives, prevent injuries, and minimize property damage by enabling residents to detect fires early in their development. The risk of dying from fires in homes without smoke alarms is twice as high as in homes that have working smoke alarms.



## Notice of Cancellation of Election

Pursuant to Utah Code 20A-1-206: A municipal legislative body may cancel an election if: all the municipal officers are elected in an at-large election . . . ; and the number of municipal office candidates, including any eligible write-in candidates . . . if any, does not exceed the number of open at large municipal offices for which the candidates have filed.

On September 27, 2011, the Providence City Council adopted Resolution 11-025 canceling the Providence City November 8, 2011 Municipal Election and certifying the following: There are three candidates for three at-large city council seats.

There are no municipal ballot propositions.
