Message from the Mayor



The Planning Commission report covers January 22 and February 12. Planning is continuing discussions on the sign regulations for both home and commercial businesses. There is also a training meeting being planned for the residing as well as new members on the Planning Commission.

The City Council report covers January 28 and February 25. The Council passed new regulations amending the City Code regarding semi-truck and trailer parking, making it more restrictive.

Stephanie Miller, Mayor of Hyrum, gave a presentation to the Council concerning the "Unplugged" program. This is an effort to reach children at the junior high level (but not restricted to that age group), encouraging less video games and television programming, and encouraging a more constructive physical activity and more time spent interfacing with family. Local businesses are involved in awarding badges for positive activity. It has become a valley wide program. The Council agreed to join in this effort. More will be reported as the program progresses.

Logan Christensen presented his Eagle Scout Project on properly disposing the American flag.

The development agreement for the Grace Baugh Subdivision was approved. The Council also adopted a resolution approving an agreement with Cache County for commercial building inspections.

In addition, Gary Millburn has been appointed as a Planning Commission member (replacing Rowan Cecil, whose term expired). Lance Campbell and Larry Hogge have been appointed as Planning Commission alternate members.

Lindsey Campbell has been appointed as a member of the Historical Preservation Commission.

The engineering for the secondary fail-safe concerning overflow for the pond at Hampshire Park is complete and we will be going out for bids.
