Item No. 1. Certified Local Government (CLG) Grant: The HPC will discuss the CLG Grant.

- G Trowbridge just wanted to confirm that the application was submitted to the Utah State Historic Preservation Office. The grant amount is for \$4,000.00. We should know when the grant is approved by the end of March 2017.

The intensive level survey will include the following five buildings: Theurer's Store 1905, now Providence Plaza; Lowell Barkle/Utah Oil Refining Co. 1933, now Burruss Automotive, Old Post Office location between 1943 and 1953; Providence Co-op 1915 now Watkin's Printing and the Post Office location in 1961 that is now the Providence Library.


