Administration Items of Interest:

Oath of Office:

The Oath of Office will be given to the newly elected officials of Providence City on Monday, January 6, 2014; 12:00 p.m. at the Providence City Office Building. The public is invited to attend.

Business Licenses:

- Business licenses are due January 1, 2014. Late penalties apply February 1. Please renew your business license early to avoid late penalties.

Dog Licenses:

- Dog license renewals are due January 1 and are considered delinquent February 1. Please make sure you have a current rabies tag or certificate. We cannot issue a dog license, if your dog's rabies shot has expired. If you no longer own a dog, or if the number of dogs you own has changed during the year, please contact the City Office so we can update our records.

Justice Court Reminder:

- With snow and frost on vehicle windshields, please remember to comply with Utah Code 41-6a-1635 Obstructed Windshield. If your windshield is not clear you may receive a \$50 fine.

Public Works Items of Interest:

Winter Parking Hours:

- Night Parking: It shall be unlawful for the driver or owner of any vehicle to park any vehicle or equipment on any street or right of way within eight feet (8') of the pavement in the City beginning . . . or December 1, whichever comes earlier, of each year and ending April 15 of the following year, between the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. the next day, for a period of time longer than three (3) minutes when loading or unloading passengers. This subsection shall not apply to doctors on house calls, emergency vehicles, or vehicles used in the repair of utilities.

The City will not be liable for any damage occurring to any vehicle or equipment parked on any street or right of way, during street and right of way maintenance.

Snow Removal:

With the snow season upon us, we have a few reminders for you.

- Please drive with caution when in the vicinity of a snowplow and remain at least 150 feet behind them.
- After your garbage and recycling cans have been emptied, please remove them as soon as possible to limit possible obstructions for the snowplows.
- When removing snow from your driveways and sidewalks, please do not push the snow out into the street. Pushing snow into the street can create banks in the travel path and cause problems for motorists.
- To prevent waterlines freezing in your home, you may need to leave a small amount of water running.

Utility Billing:

- If you have your Providence City Utility Billing set up through auto-pay through your bank, please make sure your bank has your correct utility account number; especially if you have moved from one Providence address to another Providence address.

- If you have your Providence City Utility Billing set up for recurring payments online through the Providence City website, please make sure you update your card information as soon as your expiration date changes; or if any other information changes on the card.
