New City Administrator

Long-time City Recorder Skarlet M. Bankhead has been named the new city administrator for Providence City.

Mayor Alma Leonhardt announced that Bankhead, who has served as City Recorder since 1995, was selected from a large field of applicants by the City Council on Tuesday, July 26, 2005. She will begin her duties as chief administrative officer of the City immediately, in addition to retaining her duties as City Recorder.

Leonhardt said while the Council was very impressed with the qualifications of the many candidates who applied for the administrator's position, Bankhead's knowledge and experience in Providence, as well as her excellent working relationship with the citizens of the community, was just too much to ignore. "Skarlet already knows our ordinances inside and out, and she has a great understanding of the way the Mayor and Council believe the city should be administered on a daily basis."

"Add this to an outstanding relationship with all of our City employees, and hiring Skarlet was just a natural fit we felt it was important to take advantage of," Leonhardt said.

Bankhead joined Providence City in 1991, working first as the Justice Court Clerk. She was named City Recorder in 1995, and later added the duties as head of the Finance & Records Department. "Since becoming Recorder, Skarlet has worked extensively with the City Council, the Planning Commission, our City parks and recreation programs, and has an excellent understanding of how all of our City programs function.

"As Recorder she has also been the City's budget officer, so she has a unique insight into the financial concerns of our growing city," Leonhardt said. "We're grateful she has accepted these additional duties, and we're looking forward to working together to move our city forward."

A Providence native, Bankhead and her husband, Bill, are the parents of six children.
