- D Johnson reported he told the Irrigation Company the water leak on the south end of Main Street is their responsibility. He also felt the irrigation companies needed to do a better job of keeping the culverts clean. R Eck felt the City needed to keep the entities separate on repair projects.
- D Barnes felt one of the problems with Spring Creek is that there in no attempt to make sure the water goes for beneficial use. He also explained the representatives will not repair private laterals. However, they are repairing a private lateral on the south end of Main Street.
- D Barnes reported the City fixed an irrigation problem on 400 East at approximately 300 North. The Irrigation Company had pipe on site. The City used the Irrigation Company's pipe and will bill the Irrigation Company for the work.

Council Member Stacie Gomm:

Planning Commission:

- S Gomm reported Mimi Reckor has volunteered to serve on the Planning Commission.
- Mayor Leonhardt reported Mark Malmstrom resigned.
- Mayor Leonhardt expressed concern about appointing people with preconceived ideas. V Saunders and S Gomm felt perhaps serving on the Commission would give them a better understanding of the City.

Braegger Park:

- S Gomm expressed concern about the posts at Braegger Park. She explained the Recreation Committee would like a clear direction before making any changes to the cement posts. Mayor Leonhardt explained George Daines does not want a fence. V Saunders suggested closing the road.
- R Eck felt the City could leave the posts in for safety reasons. R Eck suggested planting a hedge and leaving the post until the hedge is grown. V Saunders and R Liechty agreed.
- S Gomm would also like to see a restroom. V Saunders felt a facility should be provided. D Barnes reported the service lines for a restroom are in place.
- R Eck requested a copy of the agreement that was made when the property was donated.

Council Member Ron Liechty:

- R Liechty requested a moratorium on innerblock development. R Eck felt the Council should finish the accessory dwelling changes before starting a new moratorium. R Liechty felt there is some urgency to have a clear statement on intra-block development.
