With the above normal snowpack and with a forecast for a wet spring, we should all take the necessary time to examine our properties and determine if we may be adversely affected by the potential for high water run off.

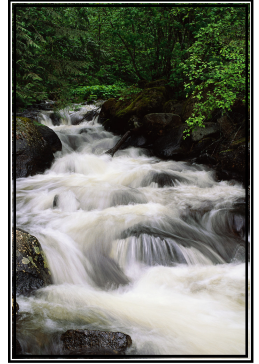
Providence City employees have and will continue to be diligent in taking measures to protect City property that is near Spring Creek and we suggest that if your property is near the creek that you do the same.

Spring Creek has historically reached its peak near the middle of June. As of the time this article is being written, we have not yet seen a sustained measurable rise in the creek.

The following actions were taken by the City Council in the meeting for March 22. There was no meeting held on April 12. We continue to seek citizen input concerning the decisions that are made on your behalf. - * Item #1: A proclamation to acknowledge the Child and Family Support Center was approved by the Mayor and City Council.
- * Item #2: Lt. Bryan Locke from the Cache County Sheriffs Office was introduced as the new Supervising Deputy for our City. He presented the annual Sheriff's Report to the Council for review.
- * Item #3: The City Council approved an amendment to Title 10 Zoning Regulations, Chapter 3, by adding Section 7 Utility and Communication Facilities.
- * Item #4: The City Council approved an amendment to the Development and Public Improvement Installation Agreement for the Eagle View Estates Phase 2. Approved by resolution to extend the completion date.

We hope that Spring will finally be here and we can all get our Spring clean-up finished. The Green Waste bins are being fully used at the City sheds and are a great help in keeping our City "Green". These bins are placed in our City as a service. We encourage the citizens to help keep the area around the bins clean and well managed.

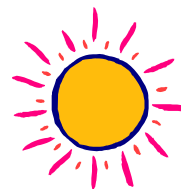
