MESSAGE FROM YOUR CITY COUNCIL:

February 28, 2012

No meeting was held.

March 13, 2012 Meeting:

- ▶ A proclamation was approved by the Council and signed by the Mayor proclaiming April as "Child Abuse Prevention Month". A short presentation was given by Diane Behl from the Child and Family Support Center.
- ▶ The Council considered a request from Morris Poole to rezone 6.78 acres at 420 West 100 North from Agriculture to Commercial General District (CGD) and 3.17 acres to Single Family Residential (SFR). The request was continued until meeting on March 27.
- ▶ The Council approved a request from the Providence Historic Preservation Commission to add an Intensive Level Survey to the Canyon CLG Grant request for the quarry in Providence Canyon. The cost of this study will be reimbursed back to the city.
- ▶ Providence City "Storm Water Regulations" was amended to better define the regulations and bring them in line with EPA standards.
- ▶ The Council is studying a modified road profile for Canyon Road. Further study will be forthcoming when costs and design are determined. Improvements will be paid from impact fees that have been collected from development and must be used in the coming months.
- ▶ After discussion and citizen input, the Council and City Staff agreed to keep the starting time of City Council meetings at the 6:00 pm hour on the second and fourth Tuesdays unless otherwise posted.

As your City Council, we continue to ask for citizen involvement in our City functions and government. We are elected to serve you and encourage your input, thoughts, and ideas for our City.

The green waste bins are now at the Public Works Facility (350 East Center) and available for use. We would ask that if the bins are full that you come back rather than place your green waste on the ground.

We have requested from Logan City two garbage dumpsters for spring cleanup. Watch for them around the 20th of April and they will be here for 2 weeks. One will be located at the Public Works Facility and the other at 400 South Main.

We will start reading water meters April 15th, please make sure that the entire water meter lid is accessible to the readers.

The City will begin picking up green waste/branches on Monday, April 23rd. Please do not put out any stumps or any branches that are longer than 10 feet or bigger than 6 inches in diameter. We will go over the entire City one time. After we have been along your street, please do not put more branches out.
