Amateur Radio Class—Be a HAM! HAM Class starts October 27

The City of River Heights is sponsoring a class for all those interested in getting their Technician Amateur Radio License or just want to find out what HAMS are all about. The technician license is the most popular license.

The class is designed to teach you everything you need to know to pass the FCC Test. YOU DO NOT need a technical background of any type and Morse Code is no longer required! The technician class license helps you know the rules of the road (airways), so you can get on the air. In fact, you don't even need to own a radio to get on the air. There are radio transmitters all over the world that you can log onto, through the internet, and use after you get your license.

FCC Age Requirement: None **How long does the class last:** 6 weeks
