12 Item No. 1. The HPC will consider approval of the minutes from the January 15, 2013 Historic
13 Preservation Commission meeting.

22 Item No. 2. Providence Pioneer Heritage Inc. Report. The HPC will hear a report by Kathleen
23 Alder.

- 24 • K Alder – update on Spring Creek Festival to honor founding of Providence, to be held
25 April 19 and 20th, 2013. Solicited help from Historic Preservation in advertising to assure
26 as many people are aware of festival as possible. Funds raised from this festival can help
27 benefit Historic Preservation projects.
- 28 • A selection of students from high school, middle school and elementary schools will be
29 giving presentations on Providence heroes. Asked for help from Historic Preservation
30 Committee for names of Providence heroes to submit to students who will participate.
- 31 • K Harris asked if K Alder had permission from schools for students to participate in this
32 way. Scheduled class time may be an issue for students to write these papers. K Alder has
33 spoken to and is working with Janet Willardson at the Middle School. She is going to
34 make it an assignment in her classes.
- 35 • Friday night will be a fun night: old fashioned square dance in gym.
- 36 • Saturday – cabbage head fun run, entertainment events are scheduled every 30 minutes,
37 games, sack races, 3-legged races, stilt walking, arm wrestling. Winners of events will get
38 trophies and prizes. Sauerkraut recipe tasting, historic home tours, quilt and art displays,
39 baseball at Zollinger Park, and hoping to have a grand prize drawing which you must be
40 present to win. When someone purchases from vendors, they will get a ticket for the
41 grand prize drawing.
- 42 • J Hicken commented that the turn out last year was perhaps effected by so many other
43 activities going on. Hopefully this year other events won't interfere.
- 44 • Weather is a concern. Kathleen is looking at renting a tent for inclement weather. The
45 elementary school is also available.
- 46 • Lots of advertising, including out of town.
- 47 • There is a Facebook Page called Spring Creek Festival.

49 Item No. 3. Historian Report. The HPC will hear a report by Carol Nyman.

- 50 • Carol was not in attendance.

1 Item No. 4. CLG Grant Update. The HPC will discuss the progress of the CLG Grant
2 components, and review their in-kind hours to date.

- 3 • J Hicken – Report of CLG Grant update and in-kind hours.
- 4 • K Braegger - sent pictures of the quarry. J Hicken asked H Christenson to look at the
5 pictures to verify what they are.
- 6 • J Hicken would like to start with history of quarry operations – how they started, costs,
7 interviews, why we mine limestone, etc. Would like to show action films of the dynamite,
8 etc. Would like to show what impact the quarry had on Providence history, such as the
9 work it provided, how many people worked there, economic considerations, etc.
- 10 • The next move is to go to a story board.
- 11 • H Christenson – has some 8mm film of blasting, rock crusher running. He has 25-30
12 pictures he would like to scan and use them.
- 13 • J Hicken has a couple of drafts he would like the Historic Commission to review and then
14 give input.
- 15 • A Leonhardt thought it would be good to have information of how the rock was used in
16 beet and sugar beet production.
- 17 • J Hicken – perhaps farmers should be included in this project since they were the primary
18 users of the limestone to convert the beets to sugar. Video is limited to 14 minutes so
19 there are limits as to what can be included.
- 20 • K Harris felt like the sugar beets need to be mentioned because of the historical
21 importance.
- 22 • K Seethaler asked about Korral Broschinsky's position. Skarlet reported that Korral was
23 waiting for the weather. Korral also said if there was any historic information that you
24 acquire she would love to have it passed on so she can include it in her intensive level
25 survey.
- 26 • J Hicken – asked about in-kind hours.
- 27 • S Bankhead – forms will be given to Karl Seethaler to sign.
- 28 • K Seethaler – scholarships for CLG Conference are in. Two scholarships worth \$120.
29 Will give the scholarships to Skarlet and she will distribute information to everybody.
30 Conference is May 9-11, 2013. If more than two want to go, there is money in the budget
31 for others to attend.
- 32 • J Hicken – if someone on the Preservation Commission can't attend conference, perhaps
33 someone from Providence Pioneer Heritage, Inc. could go.




