18 Rob Stapley, Public Works Director:

- 19 • Street maintenance will begin. This includes HA5 and chip and seal treatments. There will be some 24-
20 hour closures. Both Spring Creek crossings have begun. The water system SCADA upgrade is complete.
- 21 • Traffic flow and signage on Spring Creek Parkway was discussed.
- 22 • Chip and seal treatment was discussed, including the new chips we will be using. Possible rebuilds on a
23 few streets were discussed.

25 Skarlet Bankhead, Administrative Services Director

- 26 • We have many applications coming in for land use. Pickle ball classes have begun. The new budget year
27 has begun, including market and cost of living adjustments for staff.
- 28 • Code enforcement was discussed. The City Celebration was discussed. C Kirk felt that we should discuss as
29 a Council whether we are still comfortable holding the celebration [due to COVID 19].

56 **Item No. 1. Consider application for 2020 COG road funds:** Prior to submitting an application for 2020 COG road
57 funding for design and engineering services for street improvements for 100 South between 200 West and 400
58 West, the City Council is holding a public hearing. The purpose of the public hearing is to provide an opportunity
59 for anyone interested to comment on the proposed application before action is taken.

62 **Administrative Business Item(s):**

63 **Item No. 1. Application for 2020 COG road funds.** The Providence City Council will consider the public hearing
64 comments regarding the application for 2020 COG road funds and may make a decision to proceed with the
65 application.

- 66 • Max Pierce, City Engineer, gave a presentation about the proposed improvements to 100 South.
- 67 • The Council discussed the best way to share the plans with the residents of 100 South.

68
69 **Item No. 2. Discussion – Green Waste:** The Providence City Council will discuss a recommendation given to the
70 Cache County Council by the Solid Waste Advisory Board for green waste.

- 71 • Mayor Drew explained the background of the proposal given by Issa Hamud, Logan City Environmental
72 Director, to the County Council. The three options from I Hamud’s presentation were discussed. J Paulsen
73 was in favor of option #3 because he felt that this is what the residents want. C Kirk and J Sealy were also
74 in favor of option #3 because of resident feedback.
- 75 • R Stapley discussed the options from a public works standpoint. R Stapley hoped that option #3 would
76 include more frequent pickups by Logan City.
- 77 • The \$1.50 per household per month fee for option #3 was discussed, as well as the abuse by commercial
78 landscaping companies.
- 79 • B Speth is in favor of option #2. He felt that we are close enough to the Logan land fill for people to drive
80 and that our drop site becomes a mess because people don’t respect it when it is full.

82 **Item No. 3. Resolution 025-2020 – Approval of RFP.** The Providence City Council will consider for adoption a
83 resolution accepting a proposal for a comprehensive strategic municipal parks and recreation continuous
84 improvement master plan.

- 93 • R Snow explained the process of scoring the proposals and making a recommendation. The committee is
94 recommending MHTN.

96 **Item No. 4. Resolution 026-2020 – Fiber.** The Providence City Council will discuss the possibility of creating a fiber
97 utility, and may adopt a resolution declaring their intent to proceed with the installation of fiber throughout the
98 City.

- 99 • The subscriber option (where only those who subscribe pay) and the utility option (where all residents
100 pay at least a base fee) were discussed. The subscriber option would give residents a choice and therefore
101 might avoid some backlash, but the utility option would most likely provide a better service at a better
102 cost even for those who only use basic internet. The different debt risk levels to the city were also
103 discussed. The subscriber model puts the city at risk if there are not enough subscribers.
- 104 • S Bankhead explained that a motion tonight will not award any contract. There are still several steps in
105 the process that we would need to go through. This motion tells the staff that the Council is interested in
106 a model similar to the STRATA model and that we should proceed accordingly.

- 107 • R Snow explained that the next step would be to ask STRATA for a design of the system, which would be
108 the same regardless of which model was chosen. The Council discussed bidding out the design work for a
109 fiber optic system. The situation of residents who want to remain with their current cable TV providers
110 was discussed, as well as the difficulties that the city would incur if it decided to maintain the system itself
111 rather than contracting it out.
