In the Garbage Business

After Logan City made the decision to step back from providing waste collection services for Cache County, Providence City is moving forward on its plan to start managing its own.

Under the Public Works department, Providence City will purchase three new garbage trucks that will provide garbage collection for our city, disconnecting from Logan City services.

The plan is in the early stages of development, starting with the portions that will take the longest to fulfill. It is expected to take up to two years for trucks to be delivered and service to begin.

More details on the waste collection plan will be forthcoming. Stay tuned to future City Council meetings and newsletters for more information as it becomes available.



Getting Connected to Fiber

The Providence City fiber project is well underway. Below are the steps you can expect the process to follow as you wait for fiber to be installed at your home.

- Once your neighborhood is ready for fiber, a representative from STRATA Networks will determine the best route to bring fiber directly to your home. This may happen before you see construction crews.
- After fiber is brought to your home, you will be contacted via email to select which Internet Service Provider (ISP) you would like to receive service from.
- Crews will then be notified that you are ready for an in-home installation and STRATA Networks will contact you to schedule an appointment.
- Depending on your ISP choice, you may have an additional in-home installation. If you have not heard from your ISP after your initial installation, please reach out to them directly to finish your setup.

Winter Parking Regulations



As a reminder, winter parking hours are still in effect through April 15. Parking in the city right-of-way is prohibited between midnight and 6 a.m.

All vehicles and equipment must be at least eight feet away from the asphalt in areas with no curb.

Citations for parking violation will be issued.
