➤ Item No. 1 Homes at 291 Preliminary Plat: The Providence City Planning Commission will discuss, consider, and may take action on a request to approve a preliminary plat for Homes at 291, a 3lot single-family residential subdivision located at 291 N 100 E. (PLAT ANALYSIS)

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• Michael Fortune called item 1, gave a brief introduction and asked Skarlet Bankhead to give an

overview of the Preliminary Plat.

Skarlet Bankhead reviewed with Planning Commission the staff report noting what State and

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- City Codes were used to analysis this preliminary plat making sure it was in compliance. Reported that this parcel has a home, mobile home, and detached garage existing on this property. The home will remain; the mobile home and garage will be removed. This is a 3-lot residential subdivision. Lots 1 and 2 are adjacent to and will access 100 E. Lot 3 is not adjacent
  - to 100 E but does have access to 100 E through a 24-ft wide driveway easement on Lot 2. Ms. Bankhead cited that this analysis is standard to what they have seen before but mentioned that she included in the conclusion section a piece regarding the city's recently approved
  - moderate income housing plan.
  - Ms. Bankhead discussed with the Planning Commission the City's general and master plans and how this parcel fits or complies with those plans, such as park proximity, transportation, and future development.
  - Ms. Bankhead referenced the comments in red in the staff report advising that the applicant has resolved most of those issues. Discussed with the Planning Commission plans for a fee-in-lieu for the property, service lines, waster water collection and treatment plans and fees, as well as the culinary water master plan.
  - Discussed the preliminary plat map and its referenced street cross sections, wells, existing services, and map notes.
  - Relayed that Aaron Walker, deputy fire marshal, has submitted his letter regarding fire and life safety issues with access and hydrant locations.
  - The Planning Commission read the preliminary plat map notes for the record.
  - Parties talked about the moderate-income housing guidelines and goals that they have set. Parties referenced the current housing market and improving the city's infrastructure.
  - Parties outlined the definition of inner block developments and what the requirements are for inner block developments.
  - Parties continued discussion regarding the goals they set with their moderate-income housing report and how they will define meeting those goals and showing progress.
  - Danny MacFarlane, applicant, briefly described the preliminary plat and asked if the Planning Commission has any questions. Brian Marble asked about irrigation lines and sidewalks. Mr. MacFarlane responded that the irrigation lines will be piped, and they will complete the sidewalk in front of the property.
  - Shelly Nazer thanked the applicant for compromising and listening to the residents.

- The Planning Commission all commented that the preliminary plat looked good and that they did not see any issues.
- Michael Fortune informed the Planning Commission that he would be stepping outside during the vote as he has personal interest in this item.
